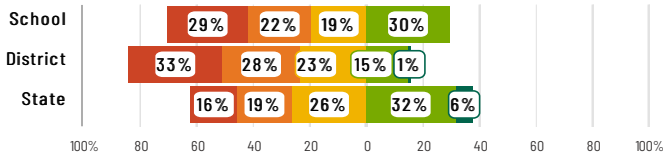

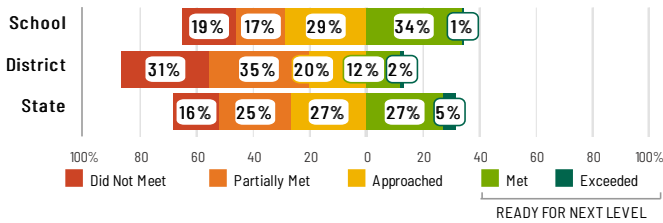
Academic Success

English Language Arts



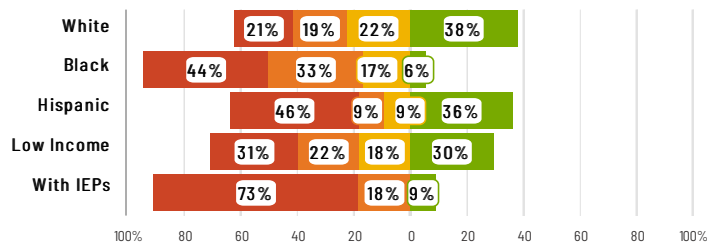

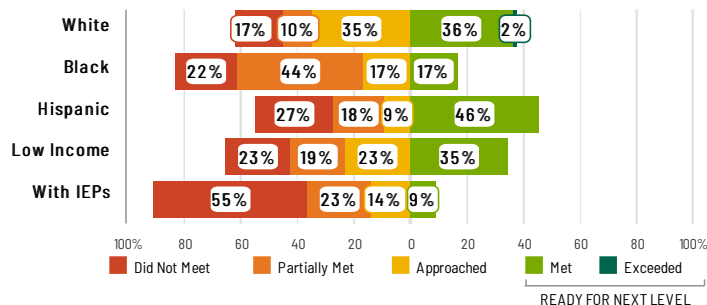
Success by Student Group

This display shows IAR ELA & Math performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.

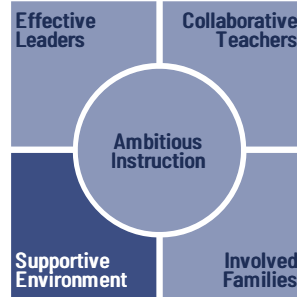
English Language Arts

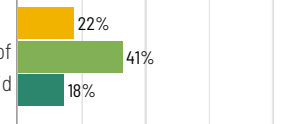
Attendance Rate

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences



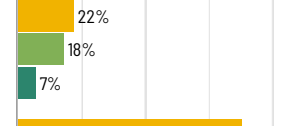
Chronic Absenteeism

Percentage of students who miss 10% or more of school days per year either with or without a valid excuse



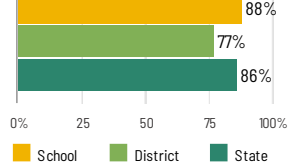
Student Mobility

School Personnel Resources

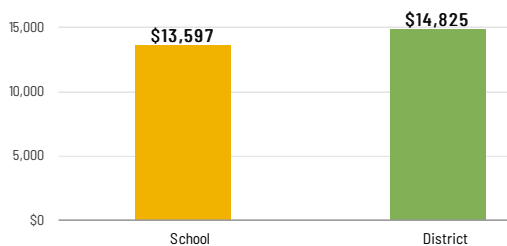

Facilities

Southwest Elementary School, finished in 2001, uses Illinois Standards to drive its instruction. Our philosophy is that we do what it takes to move students forward! School-Level Finance
