Success by Student Group

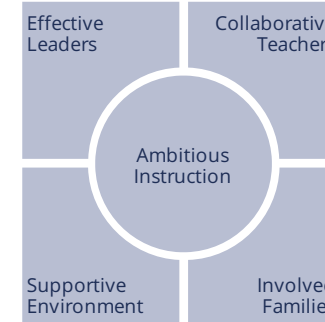
This display shows SAT performance levels for each student group. No data is shown for groups with fewer than 10 students.

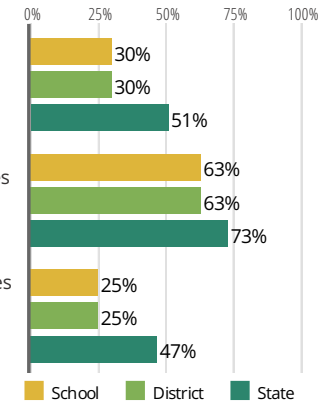

School Highlights

Academic Courses

Danville High School prides itself in providing students with a wide-range of academic and extracurricular opportunities to ensure that all students are college and career ready. We have a robust Honors and Advanced Placement program that challenges students and a strong partnership with Danville Area Community College.

Physical Education, Health and Wellness

DHS offers a variety of options for Physical Education: Dance, Beginner & Advanced Swimming, Sports Medicine, Weight Training, and Adapted PE. Students may also meet their PE graduation requirements through our JROTC program. The Viking 5K is offered each fall for participation from our families and community. Our free meal program is open to all.

Other Programs and Activities

Danville High School has over 20 clubs that meet all of our students individual interests from Student Council to new creations such as Gaming Club and Viking Ambassadors. There is something for everyone at Danville High School and every effort is made to help students find their niche.

School Awards

Students at Danville High School were awarded over \$125,000 in scholarships. The school prides itself as promoting excellence, as our very own Mr. Houpt was a top ten finalist for Those Who Excel Teacher of the Year for Illinois. A strong athletic program with our cross country team attending state and Viking Football advancing to playoffs.

Career Development Courses and Programs

Danville High School has a wide-array of courses focused in-house on career development through the Career and Technical Education division with courses such as Intro to Engineering, Welding, Automotive Technology, and Business. The partnership with Danville Area Community College provides additional coursework via College Express.

Athletics

DHS has over 20 athletic programs that have distinguished themselves on the field of competition that students can choose from during the school year. Studies show that athletic involvement helps to structure the student and aid in academic success during the high school years.

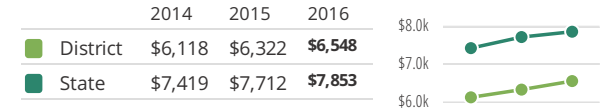
DHS has a full range of staff to support teachers and students on a daily basis.

Facilities

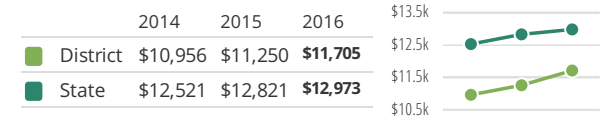
Originally built in the 1920s, DHS has the charm of a building with a rich heritage with all the amenities of a modern construction. Spring 2016, the district applied for \$3.4 million in federal funding. Over 100 windows will be replaced, and upgrades will be made to electrical, including lighting in the gymnasium, corridors and auditorium.

District Finance

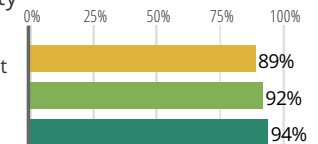
Educator Measures

Student Attendance and Mobility

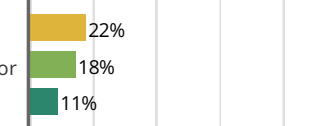
Attendance Rate

Rate at which students are present at school, not including excused or unexcused absences



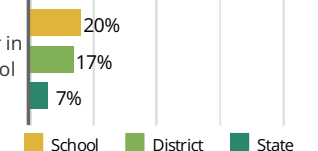
Chronic Truancy Rate
