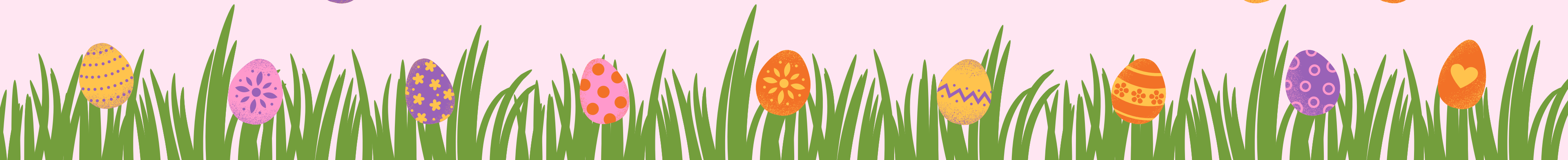

Summer school information will be coming home soon. Summer school will be for academic interventions only not for promotion.

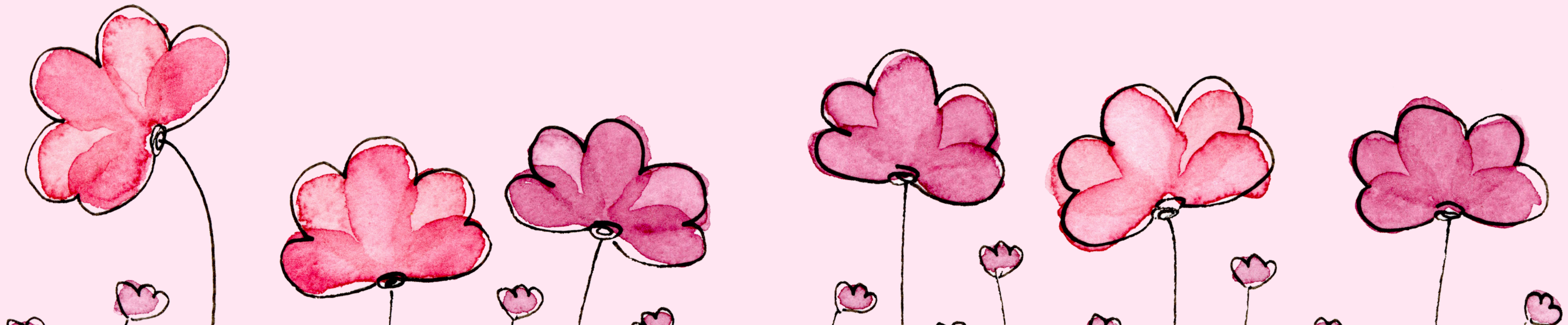
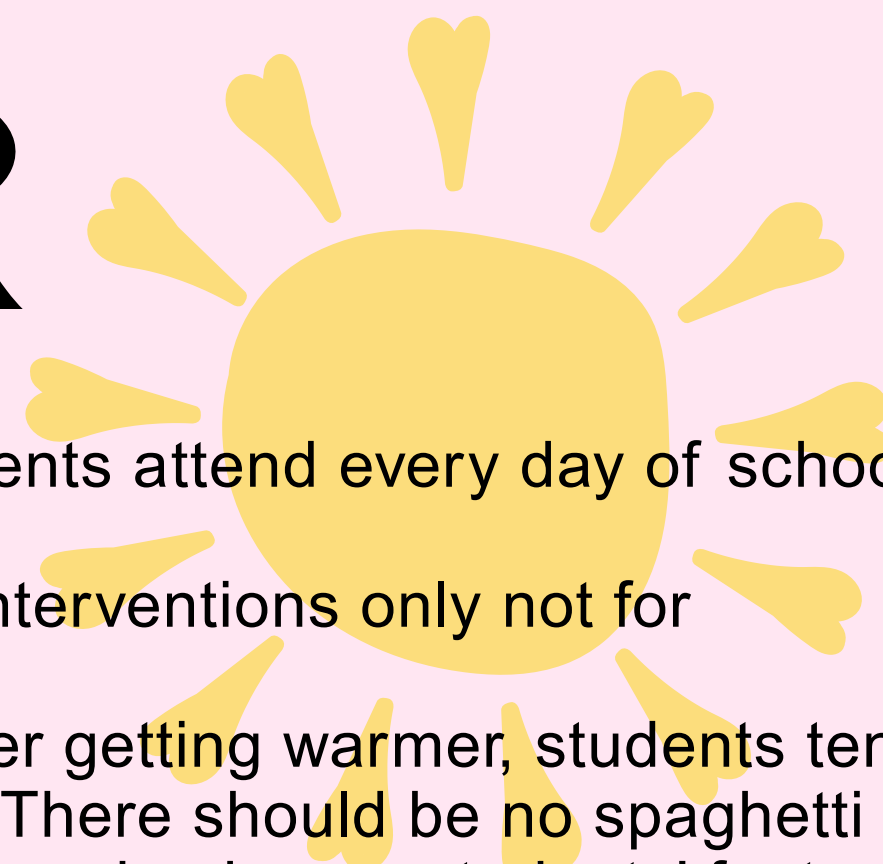

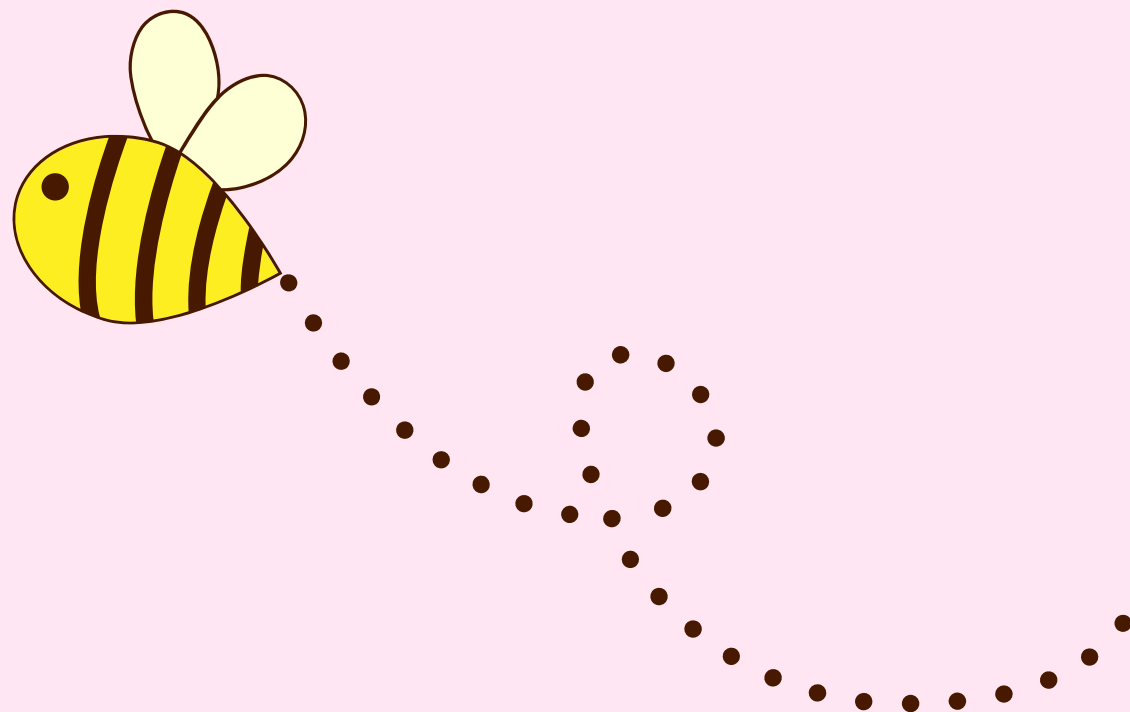
AVID

As this time of year is full of testing dates, please make sure your student is getting plenty of sleep, practicing skills at home, and has good attendance.

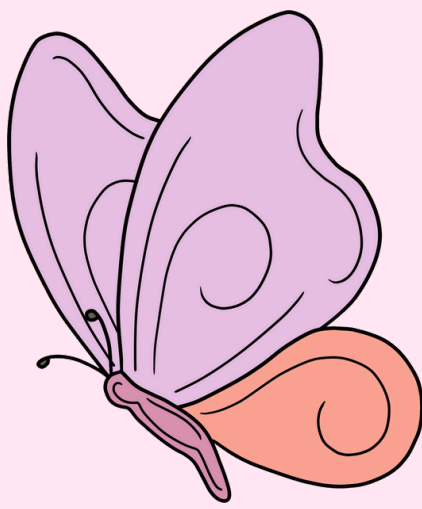

Attention South View Upper Elementary 5th grade Guardians:

ALL 5th grade students need to be medically compliant to enter the 6th grade. Your student will not be able to begin their 6th grade year without a current physical and updated vaccines on file.

Typical compliant needs are: New State of Illinois Physical, Tdap vaccine, Meningococcal vaccine, and Hepatitis B vaccine.

To ensure a smooth start to the 2025-2026 school year, we encourage you not to delay in completing this requirement.

Our school health-based clinic, Southern Illinois Healthcare Foundation (SIHF), will be at South View offering onsite physicals and vaccinations!

SIHF will be at South View the week of May 12, 2025

Packets have been mailed home to all 5th grade families.

Completion and return of the packet is mandatory for your student to be seen by SIHF.

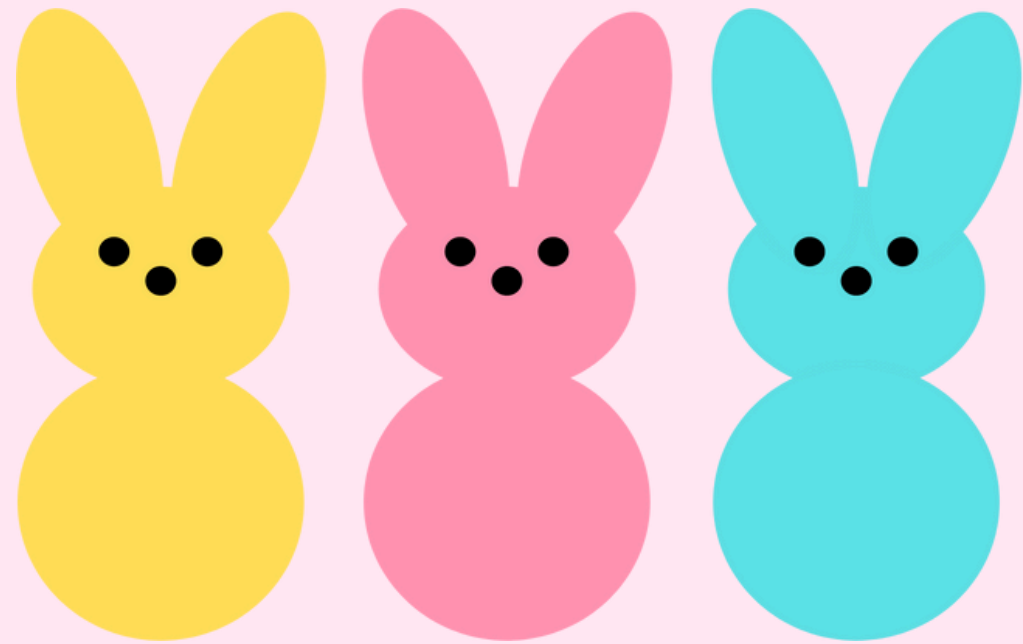

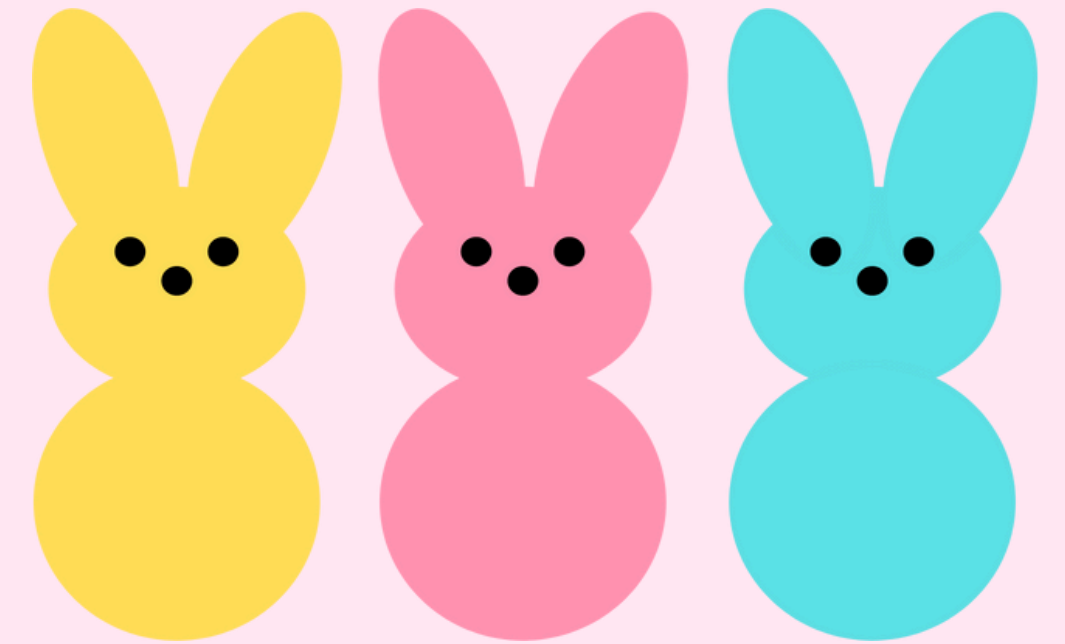
