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Coat season is upon us!! Please label your child's COAT, HAT AND GLOVES with their first and last name. We are working on the letters Nn, li and Ff. Our new sight words this month are: she, can, a, and is. We will be finishing our theme "Every Story Has Characters and beginning our new theme "Plants and Animals Have Needs". Your child should be reading the sight words and CVC words with the letters we have taught. Rereading all books and papers that come home will help your child be a successful reader. Your child is growing and beginning to read!!! Thank you for your help at home. It makes a difference!!!

In Math, we will be working on comparing 0 - 10 and learning about shapes!!!

Conferences will be coming up November 9 & 10. Those days will be 1:15 dismissal days. Please look for information from your child's teacher regarding conferences. Please fill out the information needed and return to school as quickly as possible!!!!

Welcome to Fall and the beautiful colors it brings It is the time of year when it starts to get colder. Remember to bundle up your children. We spend 30 minutes a day outside, and want everyone's heads, fingers and toes to be kept warm.

Right now, your child is learning to identify numbers, add +0 and +1 to numbers and counting to 120. In Reading we are working on letter recognition, learning letter sounds and increasing word recognition for those who are reading.

There just isn't enough time during the school day for your student to get all of the practice they need to build their comprehension, and confidence. Each week homework is placed in your child's green folder. It is their responsibility to make sure it is completed and their weekly calendar has your signature.

Helping your child learn is a partnership between your child's teacher, the school and you as parents. Parent / Teacher Conferences are a place where we can discuss their progress, concerns and answer any questions. They are set for Nov. 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>. Conference notes with the appointment time will be sent home. Your child's teacher will let you know if they will be in person or over the phone.

Be sure to get in the habit of checking Class Dojo on a daily basis. We post events, special announcements there and you just might see a picture of your child in class.

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
