

2021 State Spring Illinois Assessment Information

The United States Secretary of Education has decided not to grant waivers for the administration of spring 2021 assessments. The Illinois State Board of Education also believes that assessment is more important than ever as our students continue to learn in unprecedented conditions. Illinois schools are currently operating under Restore Illinois Phase 4, which allows in-person instruction while following public health requirements. The ACCESS for English Language Learners grades K-12 will be administered in person January, 2021. The Illinois Assessment of Readiness will be administered in person to grades 3-8 in the Spring of 2021Illinois Science Assessment will be administered to grades 5, 8, and 11. The testing window for the Illinois Assessment of Readiness and Illinois Science Assessment is currently set for March 1, 2021-April 30, 2021. Schools will be preparing assessment plans that will follow state guidelines to keep all students and staff safe. Schools must follow the Illinois Phase 4 are:

- Require use of appropriate personal protective equipment, including face coverings;
- Prohibit more than 50 individual from gathering in one space;
- Require social distancing be observed, as much as possible;
- Require that schools conduct symptom screenings and temperature checks or require that individuals self-certify that they are free of symptoms before entering school buildings; and
- Require an increase in schoolwide cleaning and disinfection.

We will continue to update you regarding any change to the assessment guidelines. Building plans including schedules and transportation will be communicated in the near future.

Información de la evaluación de la primavera del estado de Illinois de 2021

El Secretario de Educación de los Estados Unidos ha decidido no otorgar exenciones para la administración de las evaluaciones de primavera de 2021. La Junta de Educación del Estado de Illinois también cree que la evaluación es más importante que nunca ya que nuestros estudiantes continúan aprendiendo en condiciones sin precedentes. Las escuelas de Illinois están operando actualmente bajo la Fase 4 de Restaurar Illinois, que permite la instrucción en persona mientras se cumplen los requisitos de salud pública. El ACCESS para estudiantes del idioma inglés de los grados K-12 se administrará en persona en enero de 2021. La Evaluación de Preparación de Illinois se administrará en persona a los grados 3-8 en la primavera de 2021 La Evaluación de Ciencias de Illinois está programada actualmente para el 1 de marzo de 2021 al 30 de abril de 2021. Las escuelas prepararán planes de evaluación que seguirán las pautas estatales para mantener seguros a todos los estudiantes y al personal Las escuelas deben cumplir con los requisitos del Departamento de Salud Pública de Illinois al administrar las evaluaciones de primavera de 2021. Esos requisitos durante la Fase 4 de Restaurar Illinois son:

- Exigir el uso de equipo de protección personal adecuado, incluidas las cubiertas faciales
- Prohibir que más de 50 personas se reúnan en un espacio;
- Exigir que se observe el distanciamiento social, en la medida de lo posible;
- Exigir que las escuelas realicen exámenes de detección de síntomas y controles de temperatura o exigir que las personas certifiquen por sí mismas que no tienen síntomas antes de ingresar a los edificios escolares; y



- Requerir un aumento en la limpieza y desinfección de toda la escuela.
- Continuaremos informándole sobre cualquier cambio en las pautas de evaluación. Los planes de construcción, incluidos los horarios y el transporte, se comunicarán en un futuro próximo.

Math

Students are finishing the unit on rates and proportional reasoning. The test for this unit will be on Monday or Tuesday, December 14th or 15th - depending on which day your student has math. All work for this unit will be due by Friday, December 18th. While out shopping, ask your students to use unit rates to comparison shop and find the better buy on the items you are purchasing. Please remember, in math, students are required to keep a math notebook. Your child may need to replenish their school supplies for the remainder of the year. This is important for the success of your child. We also have homework help/focused learning every day your child has math class at 1:00. If your child is struggling, please encourage him/her to log on to ask questions and get extra help. Also, remember to keep up with your child's assignments and grades in TeacherEase. Your child should be checking their grades weekly (at a minimum) during Impact class, but he/she also needs to know you are checking grades as well. Math

December will be a short month, so please make sure your student is attending class every day and completing their assignments. If students have missing assignments, they need to get those made up before the end of the semester. All teachers have a focused support time from 1:00-1:45 every day. Students should be attending those office times for help on any missing or current assignments.

Pre-Algebra will be graphing equations. We had assigned an IXL lesson that allowed students to practice graphing points on a coordinate grid. This is a prerequisite skill for graphing equations. If your student has not completed that assignment, please login to IXL.com and complete the 8th grade N1 lesson.

Algebra students will be working on writing and solving equations and inequalities. This is a continuation of the work they did in November.

Social Studies

During the month of December, we will be studying the Reconstruction Era—the tumultuous time period after the Civil War where our country was reunited. We will focus on how our country attempted for the first time to provide all citizens with equal rights, and then evaluate whether these efforts were ultimately successful. Students will be working quite a bit on their writing skills in this unit, and we will continue developing our writing skills throughout the rest of the year. Please remind your students to attend their live classes every day and complete all work as assigned. Also, remember that students can take advantage of the Focused Support tutoring time from 1-1:45. The audition is a way to see your potential. Do not feel pressured to create a "perfect" audition. Students who are brave and able to have fun during the process will naturally show us their potential.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How will this work?

A: We will mail music to students at home. We will record the voice parts and make those available for students to rehearse at home. Choreography videos will also be sent to each student. We will meet online for one hour on Tuesdays beginning in January 2021. Once it is safe to meet in person, we will meet in small groups for about 30 minutes per week.

Q: What kind of songs will we do?

A: The Redcoats will start with The Greatest Show from the movie "The Greatest Showman". Students will help select additional songs. The Radiant Reds will do a baseball theme show and will start with The Champion by Carrie Underwood and Ludacris.

Q: How much will it cost?

A: There will be no cost to students. We will work to get our show shirts sponsored.

Q: When will we perform?

A: We hope to have some live performance opportunities toward the end of the year, possibly outside.
