

8th Grade Math (Pre-Algebra & Algebra

Grading has started over for 2nd semester, so students have an opportunity to start fresh and work hard. Algebra is starting Unit 6 – Systems of Linear Equations and will continue through February. Students who are currently passing Algebra should start considering whether they would prefer traditional geometry next year at DHS or if they would be interested in GeoCon – which is an elective and math together as they use geometry and construction skills. Pre-Algebra is beginning to graph linear equations. Students currently taking Pre-Algebra and passing all unit tests should plan to take Algebra next year at DHS. Any students who are struggling should take advantage of the after-school tutoring program as well as spending a little extra time with teachers to get help.
