North Ridge will monitor the student growth, including two or more races, by utilizing common assessments from district curriculum resources and interventions and review data at grade level meetings and PLCs.

**SMART Goal 2:** North Ridge Middle School will move from emerging to accomplished on the Illinois Quality Framework Standard VII: Student and Learning Development, indicators B and C by monitoring curriculum, instruction, and assessments and adjusting as needed for all groups including the sub-group two or more races by monitoring data and increasing the percentage of students above the 50th% in Fastbridge aReading and aMath by 5%.

### 7<sup>th</sup> grade Social Studies

Also, the academic focus for the remainder of the second quarter will be to post assess unit two Common Core State Standards and finish the expository writing essay.

In addition, the academic focus for third quarter will be mastery of unit three Common Core Standards. Also, students will continue to practice answering extended response prompts using Smeckens Writing Strategies and reading comprehension skill mastery through passages from the Study Sync textbook.

## 7th grade Math

Welcome back from winter break! We are starting our unit on adding and subtracting rational numbers (integers, fractions, and decimals). During this unit, we will not be using calculators on this standard. Please have your student complete their assignments without the use of the calculator so that they are prepared for quizzes and the unit test. As a reminder, students are expected to bring their required supplies to class & school daily (chrome book, agenda, etc). We will be starting second semester soon, so please check with your child to see if they need replenished supplies (pencils, notebooks, notebook paper, etc.). This is a fun unit that has lots of cool demonstrations with different types of balls, springs and pendulums. During this unit, we will learn about how energy is converted and transferred from one object to another. These simple questions will really help with retention of the material. # **Navigating Extra-Curricular Eligibility**

Students who participate in extracurricular activities at North Ridge Middle School must meet academic standards set by the IE-SA and Danville District 118 Board Policy. Students must be passing all classes in order to be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities. Eligibility grades are checked every Thursday and determine whether a student is eligible for the upcoming week (Monday to Sunday). For example, if a student is failing a class on Thursday they are ineligible to participate starting on the next Monday and running through Sunday. More information can be found on the IESA website and within Danville Board Policy 6:190. Here are some helpful tips for parents to help your child stay eligible for extracurricular activities.

- 1. Sign up for a TeacherEase Parent Account. TeacherEase is the grading software currently used by North Ridge Middle School and parents can access their child's grades at their convenience through www.teacherease.com or the TeacherEase application for smartphones. If your child is ever ineligible, you will be notified by email the day it is determined.
- 2. Talk to your child about their grade. Work with them to set goals and a plan for improving their grade.
- 3. Check your child's grades early in the week through TeacherEase. A grade of 60% or greater is considered passing. Checking it on Tuesday gives you two days to talk to teachers and/or complete assignments to improve the child's grades. All students are given opportunities to improve their grade between eligibility checks.
- 4. Communicate with your child's teacher by phone or email through the TeacherEase app. Failed classroom assessments can be retaken by students and teachers will work with students to improve their grades on assessments.
- 5. Check for missing assignments. Missing grades can drop your child's grades considerably.
- Sign your child up for Project Success. Project Success is our afterschool program that is available for all North Ridge students. It is free of charge and academic tutoring is scheduled into the program Monday Thursday before and after school.

#### 8th Grade Social Studies

Hello everyone and welcome to 2022! We hope everyone had a good break, and we wish you and your family a healthy and wonderful new year!

We will be spending the month of January learning about World War I. We will begin by learning about the MAIN causes of the Great War, and we'll even do a simulation to try to stop the war before it starts! We will also learn about the new, modern technology used in the war and the ways WWI has impacted our world. Students will continue learning how to evaluate and analyze sources, identify causes and effects, and write argumentative paragraphs.

As 1st Semester comes to a close, please check your student's grade in teacherease and make sure to encourage your student to retake any quizzes/tests (and turn in any missing work) that might help them. 
8th grade science will be wrapping up their unit on Life Science by the middle of the month and then will transition into Physical Science. This unit focuses on forces and motion in a variety of contexts: tug-of-war, baseball, planetary motion, chemical bonds, and others. It begins with a surprising anchoring activity in which a ball speeds up unexpectedly, and revisits this phenomenon several times throughout the unit. Students generalize from specific examples to construct principles commonly known as the core ideas of Newton's laws of motion. The differences between force and energy are emphasized, with rules-of-thumb being generated to decide which concept is more useful in given situations and to address crosscutting concepts of system models, and energy and matter. The unit integrates several focal scientific practices: planning and carrying out investigations; data gathering, organization, and analysis; developing and using models; and constructing explanations and engaging in argument from evidence.

Biology Students will move out of Africa and the interactions between animals and the environment and will start looking at animals in the manner of: Life is regulated at all levels: at the ecosystem, community, population, and down to the cellular and molecular levels. This storyline unit is organized into lenses to demonstrate this principle; the first lens addressed here is the community level. Each week, this unit focuses in on smaller levels of organization. They aren't necessarily in hierarchical order, but in an order that should make sense to students.

## 8th Grade Language Arts

We hope everyone had a nice holiday and were able to spend quality time with loved ones. Now it is time to get back to work. It's hard to believe first semester is nearing the end. Time certainly flies. Our students are finishing up with Unit 2 in StudySync. We will be reviewing the skills assessed on the Unit 2 Assessment. The Unit 2 Assessment will be given on January 7. Standards include: RL.8.1, RL.8.2, RL 8.3, and RL.8.4. We are also finishing up the grammar Chapter 1 which includes types of sentences and sentence structure. The standard for this Chapter is L.8.1. We are also finishing up with Vocabulary Unit 1 and assessing it. Standard L.8.4. The grammar and vocabulary assessments will be given the week of January 10th. We realize this is a lot at the end of the semester. Please encourage your child to do his or her best on these assessments as they will be counted as a test grade. # **Cell Phone Usage**

Happy New Year! We would like to remind everyone of the policy regarding cellular devices. According to the Ownership in Education Handbook 2021-2022, page 7, "During the school day, electronic signaling and cellular radio telecommunication devices **must be stored out of sight in the off mode** or unable to transmit or receive communication. Both silent vibrating or text messaging are considered unacceptable.

# **District 118 Dress Code**

Below is a brief summary of the District 118 Dress Code. This is **not** the complete policy.

## Shirts/Tops/Blouses/Jackets

- 1. No tank tops, halter tops, strapless tops, spaghetti straps, camisoles are allowed.
- 2. Jackets may be worn. Winter coats may not be worn in the classroom or cafeteria.
- 3. No midriff may be exposed.
- 4. Any item determined by the building principal(s) to be too tight or revealing is not allowed.

#### **Dresses/Skirts**

- 1.A dress must not be strapless or have spaghetti straps.
- 2. Dresses and skirts must be no shorter than fingertip length plus one inch (approximately mid-thigh/3" above knee)
- 3. No low cut dresses. Undergarments are not to be visible.
- 4. No leather, mesh, nylon/vinyl/spandex, see-through material or cutouts are allowed.
- 5. Any item determined by the building principal(s) to be too tight or revealing is not allowed.

#### Pants/Shorts

- 1. Pants must be worn at the waist; neither underwear nor skin shall be exposed. Both pant legs must be the same length. Pants must be fastened, and if a belt is worn, it must be buckled.
- 2. Shorts must be no shorter than fingertip plus one inch (approximately mid-thigh/3" above knee)
- 3. Blue jeans may be worn if free of rips and tears. It does not matter if there is material behind the rips and tears or if leggings are worn underneath. There can be NO rips, tears, or frays.
- 4. Scarves are not allowed as headgear, except for religious exemptions.
- 5. Hats, ear guards, sweatbands, bandanas, hairnets, hoods, and gloves may not be worn in the school building.
- 6. Unless prescribed by a doctor, sunglasses are not to be worn in any school building.
- 7. Chain wallets are not allowed.
