Math:

We have started Unit 1 Ratios and Proportions. Students should bring homework home about 2 to 3 times each week to complete. Just like in sports, math needs to be practiced in order to build skills. We also encourage you to check Teacher Ease regularly to keep up with your students over all grades and any missing assignments if you are unsure how to access TeacherEase, please contact the 7th grade guidance office at 444-3412. When your student is absent, for any length of time, make sure they check Google Classroom daily for the work they are missing. Students are responsible for any work missed while absent. It is important to your student's success to keep up with all assigned work. If you or your student have questions about the assigned work, please contact their math teacher. Your student should be coming to school everyday with the necessary supplies to be successful. This includes: pencils, agenda book, notebooks (paper), and a charged Chromebook. Social Studies

Hello 8th Grade families! We are now in the swing of things and moving right along! In Social Studies, we are in the middle of our unit on the Reconstruction Era. We're learning that as our country struggled to heal from the Civil War, we also struggled to provide rights to newly freed slaves. We will continue to focus on how the U.S. Constitution was amended to provide equal rights for all citizens with the 13th, 14th, and 15th Amendments and how African-Americans in particular continued to fight to ensure those changes were enforced. In this unit we are continuing to evaluate and analyze sources, and we are writing our first argumentative paragraphs.

Our next unit—the Illinois Constitution—will begin towards the end of the month. At the end of that unit (middle of November), we will take the Il Constitution Test. So get ready to study!



- 6. Need for special aids such as crutches, walkers, or wheelchairs, either on a temporary or permanent basis
