ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

In order to participate, students must meet the guidelines of both the high school and DACC in order to receive dual credit:

- High schools may require a certain GPA before they will allow a student to participate, or it is based an enrollment in a certain high school classes.
- Many of DACC's courses have reading, writing, and math prerequisites. If a student does not
 meet them with high school coursework, ACT, SAT or our placement test, they cannot enroll in the
 dual credit course. Students may take the placement test at DACC or at the high school. Contact
 the DACC Testing Center at 217.445.8708 to make an appointment, or speak to the High School
 Courselor about their cotions.
- Many of the DACC courses have course prerequisites. Dual credit students must meet the course pre-requisites before they start the dual credit course.

Hello Families,

Spring assessments have begun! In compliance with federal testing requirements, Illinois will administer the Illinois Science Assessment in grades five, eight, and eleven. The assessment is administered in an online format and is aligned to the Illinois Learning Standards for Science incorporating the Next Generation Science Standards which were adopted in 2014. (ISBE Illinois Science Assessment).

In addition, first and fourth grade students will be participating in the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) which is a gifted screener to identify students that qualify for the Motiving Academically Talented Students (MATS) program. Students will also be given an opportunity to take the test again as 2nd and 5th grades during the 21-22 school year.

Families of current MATS students, please note that while it is always great to have assessment data, it is not necessary for your child to take this test to REMAIN in the program.

Danville District 118 will be offering a date for all remote learning students in those grade levels to participate in the appropriate assessment for their grade level. On Saturday, May 15, 2021, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., remote learning students can participate in the Illinois Science Assessment and/or COGAT assessment at Mark Denman Elementary.

COVID safety recommendations by the CDC, IDPH, and ISBE will be followed including mandated mask wearing and the six feet social distancing guideline. There will be no more than 15 students in each classroom when taking the assessment. Students will be required to bring their school provided device for the assessment and any snacks or bottled water if needed.

To participate, please contact Cathie Witte, Curriculum Administrative Assistant, at 217-444-1092. Transportation will be arranged for any student in need. Students must be signed up by May 1, 2021.
