Attention Parents! Now is the perfect time to get school physicals and immunizations done for the 2021-2022 school year. ALL incoming 9th grade students must have a school

physical completed within the past year, and ALL incoming 12th grade students are required to be up to date with the Meningococcal Vaccine. (Two doses are required unless the first dose was given after the age of 16). I would like for all 11th grade students to have their vaccines completed by June 1st so I can get them entered and ready for registration in June. 8th grade students can turn their completed physicals in to the nurse at North Ridge.
