Students can use their SV bucks that are earned for being safe, kind, and responsible to purchase snacks at the movie.


Special Education

Public schools like ours continue to face several challenges, and students with special needs and circumstances often suffer the most when administration, teachers and staff are ill-equipped to overcome them. Truancy, poor student engagement, behavioral disruptions, among other challenges can be alleviated with flexible seating. Research shows that flexible seating promotes student engagement, and any teacher, here at South View, will tell you, when students are engaged, they are more focused, with less behavioral outbursts, and greater learning outcomes.

Several common trends emerged from a recent qualitative study:

“Common themes included that students prefer a specific seating choice in the classroom, flexible seating options were selected more than traditional seating options, and some students needed teacher directed instruction on modifications needed with seating choice or reminders how to sit in a specific choice. With these findings, it promoted a more collaborative work environment in the classroom.” (Cole, Schroeder, Bataineh, and Al-Bataineh, 2021)

Mr. Cravens’ students prefer flexible seating options, especially during independent skills practice. There is a carpeted calming corner with cushioned mats and movable wall partitions. There is a doorless storage room with a desk and a chair. Some students like to create little nooks throughout the room, under tables, behind open cabinet doors or tucked behind large office desks with Mrs. Olson and Ms. Miller, two of the most kind and patient paraeducators in the district. Some traditional student desks have BouncyBands, thick rubber straps connected about 8 inches from the bottom of the desk’s legs. Students struggling with symptoms associated with ADHD, who require sensory accommodations can rest their feet on the band and bounce their legs to self-stimulate during instruction or independent practice with minimal disruptions to their peers.



5th Grade Math & Science

Math: Students will apply and extend their understanding of multiplication and division to fractions. We will solve and create fraction word problems. Please continue to have students practicing multiplication facts.

Science: Students will understand how parts of the Earth's systems interact to create natural phenomena. They will focus on how people affect and protect Earth's resources.

ELA & Social Studies


ELA: Students are reading the book Don Quixote. While reading students will be practicing the skills of identifying character traits and examining how they change throughout a story. They are also reviewing the skills of summarizing and using text evidence to support their reasoning for answers.

For writing, students are working on persuading readers by forming opinions and supporting their reasoning. One main focus of writing this month is having complete sentences and subject verb agreement.

SS: Students are learning about colonization of the Americas. Students will discuss how cultural changes, and geographical developments came to be in the continent of North America.

Last month, students were able to research influential African American's throughout history. This month, students will research influential Women in history for Women's History Month.

Students are also participating in a book study of the story, The Devil's Arithmetic. This book discusses the events of the Holocaust.


