



A Note from Your School Nurse....




When to stay home: Fever 100° or higher, vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours, having a known infectious illness or rash, lice, eye drainage that cannot be maintained properly, having an ER visit within the past 24 hours.

11 year old medical requirements: New Illinois Physical, Tdap and MCV vaccines. All other vaccines need to be up-to-date as well. **Female students:** Please ensure you have a change of pants and the needed feminine products stored in your locker for an unexpected start of your menstrual cycle.

By teaching and reinforcing academic behaviors and higher-level thinking at a young age, AVID Elementary teachers create a ripple effect in later grades. Elementary students develop the academic habits they will need to be successful in middle school, high school, and college, in an age-appropriate and challenging way. Children learn about organization, study skills, communication, and self-advocacy. AVID Elementary students take structured notes and answer and ask high-level questions that go beyond routine answers. College and careers are no longer foreign concepts, and teachers provide the academic foundation students need to be on a path for college and career success. ELA – Students will be reading about Early American Civilizations including the Maya, Aztec, and Incan people. Students will be working on the skills of: finding text evidence to support reading response questions, writing with complete sentences, fixing run-on sentences, working with prefixes il- inter- and ir-, using context clues to help determine the meaning of unknown words, and will be practicing having conversations about reading.

After reading, students will be drafting and editing informative writing pieces about the Early American Civilizations. Informative writing focuses on the trait of organization in writing.

Social Studies – Students will be wrapping up learning about Native Americans in North America and will be evaluating how early explorers impacted the Native Americans way of life. Students will be studying the motivational factors for early exploration and colonization in the 1400's and 1500's.
